On June 7th, 2010 you were notified that Erie Renewable Energy was planning on submitting an application for a new tire derived fuel power plant in the Keystone Industrial Park. Since that time the official name of the company has been changed to Crawford Renewable Energy. This notice is being re-sent using the new company name.

Please be notified that that Crawford Renewable Energy (CRE) plans on submitting in early August 2010 a Plan Approval Application to PA DEP to build a 90net megawatt tire-derived-fuel (TDF) power plant in the Keystone Industrial Park off of Adamsville Road in Greenwood Township. The plant will consist of two circulating fluidized bed boilers (CFBs) equipped with state-of-the-art air pollution control equipment and other equipment necessary to operate the power plant. Tires will be processed on site for use in the CFBs. The plant will also consist of a number of silos to hold limestone, sand, lime and ash products. A number of covered conveyors will be used to transfer material throughout the process. 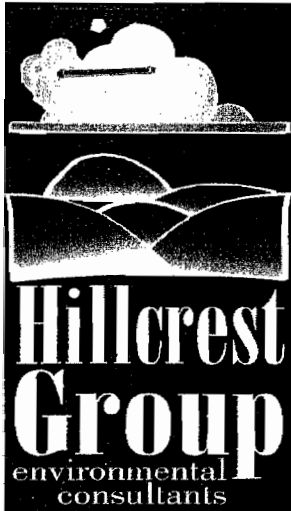

Please find enclosed three copies of a Plan Approval Application for the proposed Tire Derived Fuel (TDF) Electric Generating facility that is planned for the Keystone Industrial Park in Greenwood Township, Crawford County, PA. I have also attached an additional copy of the modeling report with a CD of the modeling parameters. As discussed during our pre-application meeting on July 20th, CRE plans on installing two 50 MW (gross) Circulating Fluidized Bed (CFB) steam generating units. Each unit will be controlled with a fluidized bed scrubber, a fabric filter and regenerative selective catalytic reduction (RSCR) that will exhaust to a single stack. CRE also plans on installing a totally enclosed TDF processing facility at this location.


We believe that we have submitted a comprehensive application that meets all of the Department's requirements. We have chosen air pollution control technologies that meet both State and Federal BACT, LAER and BAT requirements. The air dispersion modeling indicates that all criteria pollutant impacts fall below EPA's Significant Impact Levels (SILs). The voluntary toxic modeling and RA will be submitted in the near future. Due to topography and stack height all air toxic impacts are lower than what was submitted and acceptable in the previous application for the proposed Erie plant.

Also included with the application package is a check made payable to the Pa. Clean Air Fund to cover the application fee required by this application.

The CRE staff and their consultants remain available to meet with your staff at any time to further clarify any questions that you may have regarding this application.


